Geneva Lacrossers Win State Scholastic Title From Central High Team

In the roughest game of Lacrosse ever recorded against scholastic players in Central New York, Geneva High School's roughy team Saturday defeated Central High of Syracuse by a score of 3 to 1. It was the second victory of the year for Geneva over Central, the first score having been 4 to 2.

The double victory crowned Geneva as scholastic champions of the State for the year.

Between Geneva and Central they have met and vanquished all rival teams as fast as they put in an appearance.

CENTRAL SUFFERS PENALTIES.

Although both sides were ready for rough play Saturday, the majority of the roughness can be checked up against the Central High. The result was that several of its players were penalized and the team lost the services of those men for many valuable minutes.

Central's defense was too weak for the strong attack of the Genevans. The Genevan defense was on the other hand too strong for the attack of the Centralites. Only once in the second half did Central manage to penetrate the Geneva defense for a goal.

Geneva made all its goals in the first half. Bergman scored first in the 15th minute of play. Two minutes later Vogt made the second point and four minutes later Vogt bored through the Central defense for the third goal. Geneva played safe in the second half and did not try to score.

Geneva had things pretty much its own way all through the game. Their men seemed to be better runners, better dodgers and were faster in every respect. They have full claim to the beautiful silver loving cup that will be given to winners of the Central New York Interscholastic Lacrosse Association at the end of the season.

If the winners of the Lacrosse

League of Greater New York are willing to play for the State championship somewhere at New York City the coach and the manager of the Geneva team stated that they would play them.

One game will be played by Geneva before the season closes. C. B. A. will journey over to Geneva and play. In their last game Geneva won 4-1 at Elk Park two weeks ago.
